

1. O ensino em Portugal / Education System

A educação escolar desenvolve-se em três níveis:	School education has three levels:

A educação pré-escolar é facultativa e destina-se às crianças com idades compreendidas entre os três anos e a idade de ingresso no ensino básico (6 anos).	Pre-school education is optional. It is for children with ages between 3 years and the age of registration to primary school (6 years).
O ensino básico é universal, obrigatório e gratuito e comprehende três ciclos sequenciais:	Primary School is universal, mandatory and free. It includes three cycles:
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> 1.º Ciclo: 1.º, 2.º, 3.º e 4.º anos 2.º Ciclo: 5.º e 6.º anos 3.º Ciclo: 7.º, 8.º e 9.º anos 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> 1st Cycle: 1st, 2nd, 3rd and 4th years 2nd Cycle: 5th and 6th years 3rd Cycle: 7th, 8th and 9th years
O ensino secundário é obrigatório e comprehende um ciclo de três anos (10.º, 11.º e 12.º anos de escolaridade).	Secondary school is mandatory and contains a three-year cycle (10 th , 11 th and 12 th school years).

Telephone Translation Service (STT)

The ACM (High Commission for Migration) created the Telephone Translation Service (STT) to overcome the language barrier, one of the great difficulties experienced by immigrants in their relationship with the services in Portugal.

The STT offers a database of 60 translators/interpreters that fluently speak, besides Portuguese, one or more languages, and is aimed at Portuguese speakers / foreigners who need to communicate with foreigners and Portuguese citizens / entities.

This service sets a telephone conference between the manager of the service institution, a translator and the migrant.

The service is available free of charge (the customer only pays for the phone call) every working day between 9:00am and 7:00pm, through the Migrant Support Line - 808 257 257 – if you call from land line, the call cost is the same as a local call; and +351 218 106 191 – if you call from a mobile phone.

Portuguese as a Second Language (PL 2) - Português Língua Não Materna (PLNM)

General Information

Context

In order to improve the educational success of the migrant students recently arrived in the Portuguese educational system, the Ministry of Education and Science has been implementing educational policies of support regarding the acquisition of the Portuguese language, as an object of study and as a language of schooling, through the offer of the school subject of Portuguese as a second language (PL2) - Português Língua Não Materna (PLNM), in primary and secondary education (ISCED 1, 2 and 3).

Goal

The intention is therefore to ensure that all students with another native language than Portuguese have equal access to the school curriculum and achieve educational success, regardless of their mother language, culture, social background, origin and age.

Curriculum

The migrant students placed in the A1, A2 and B1 language levels, according to the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages, can benefit from PLNM classes for the development of the Portuguese language and follow a specific PL2 curriculum. The migrant students placed in the B2 and C1 language levels follow the national curriculum of the subject of Portuguese and can benefit from language support classes. Furthermore, these students can also use dictionaries to support them during examinations of other school subjects.

Range

All public primary and secondary schools in the Portuguese education system offer these measures. Students who have recently arrived in Portugal have to undergo an initial process of sociolinguistic assessment and placement testing. This way, it will be possible to ascertain if these students need to benefit from these measures.

Organization

When schools can group at least 10 recently arrived students, placed in the A1, A2 and B1 language levels, they attend Portuguese as a second language subject (PLNM Subject), instead of attending the subject of Portuguese. This requires additional teaching staff. Teacher deployment is done according to the needs of the schools and the criteria defined. There is no budgetary limit. When the students are not gathered in these groups, they benefit from additional support language classes, according to the schools human resources, but follow the PL2 curriculum.

Assessment

The students placed in the A1, A2 and B1 language levels can also benefit from specific assessment criteria in the subject of PLNM, as well as final exams of PLNM, appropriate to their language level, instead of the final exams of the Portuguese subject.
